Shearwater

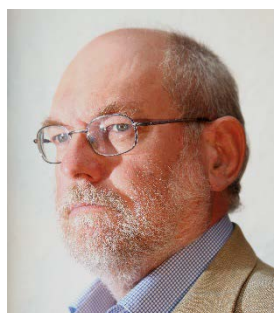

From there in 1980 Nick moved to Digital Exploration Ltd (Digicon), with roles in marketing, seismic data processing and business development in West Africa. Notably for an extended period he held the position of Managing Director of the UK company with responsibility for their EAME region. During this time they transitioned through mergers with Veritas to become VeritasDGC and lastly with CGG to become CGGVeritas.
